Decision with Statement of Reasons of the First-tier Tribunal for Scotland (Housing and Property Chamber) under Rule 26 of The First-tier Tribunal for Scotland Housing and Property Chamber (Procedure) Regulations 2017.

The Tribunal rejects the application by the applicant received by the Tribunal on 16<sup>th</sup> January 2020 being an application under section 17(1) of the Property Factors (Scotland) Act 2011.

The Tribunal sent the applicant an email dated 3<sup>RD</sup> February 2020 which requested further information to enable the application to be processed. A further email was sent to the applicant on 2<sup>nd</sup> March 2020 seeking further information. Reminders were sent to the applicant on 17<sup>th</sup> March 2020 and 24<sup>th</sup> June 2020. No information was received.

The Applicant has not provided the information requested and has had sufficient opportunity to do so.

Accordingly the Tribunal has good reason to believe that it would not be appropriate to accept the application and rejects the application in terms of rule 8 (1)(c) of the Tribunal Rules.

In terms of Section 46 of the Tribunal (Scotland) Act 2014, a party aggrieved by the decision of the Tribunal may appeal to the Upper Tribunal for Scotland on a point of law only. Before an appeal can be made to the Upper Tribunal, the party must first seek permission to appeal from the First-tier Tribunal. That party must seek permission to appeal within 30 days of the date the decision was sent to them
