Decision of the Tribunal

The Tribunal having determined that the PFEO dated 22nd July 2024 ('PFEO') relating to the Property has been complied with, certifies that the Factor has complied with the PFEO.

Reasons for the Decision

1. The Tribunal issued the **PFEO** in the following terms:

"The Factor must pay the homeowner £500 for the inconvenience he has suffered from their own funds and at no cost to the owners. The said sums to be paid within 28 days of the communication to the Factor of the Property Factor Enforcement Order."

2. On 23rd July the Factor sent the Tribunal an email confirming that on 12th July 2024 a cheque in the sum of £500, from their own funds, was raised and issued to the Homeowner.

3. On 23rd July 2024 the Homeowner sent the Tribunal an email confirming that he had received the cheque from the Factor.

4. The Tribunal were satisfied that the Factor has complied with the PFEO. The Tribunal therefore issues this Certificate of Compliance. No further action is required by the Factor in terms of the PFEO.

5. Right of Appeal

In terms of section 46 of the Tribunals (Scotland) Act 2014, a party aggrieved by the decision of the tribunal may appeal to the Upper Tribunal for Scotland on a point of law only. Before an appeal can be made to the Upper Tribunal, the party must first seek permission to appeal from the First-tier Tribunal. That party must seek permission to appeal within 30 days of the date the decision was sent to them.
