**Decision (in absence of both parties)** 

The First-tier Tribunal for Scotland (Housing and Property Chamber) ("the Tribunal") determined that

- Background
- 1. This is an application for an order for payment of rent arrears and damages alleged to be owed by the Respondents to the Applicant in relation to their occupation of the Property in terms of a private residential tenancy. It called for case management discussion ('CMD') at 11:30am on 30 August 2024, by teleconference. Neither party called in to the conference or was represented.
- The Respondents had indicated that they intended to oppose the application in an application for a postponement. That application was refused on 29 August 2024.

- · Reasons for Decision
- 3. The Tribunal cannot determine the application fairly without the Applicant being present to address it on the application. That is especially the case where an intention to oppose the application has been indicated by the Respondents, albeit they too have failed to appear. The Applicant has failed to co-operate with the Tribunal to such an extent that it cannot deal with the proceedings justly and fairly.
