## Housing and Property Chamber First-tier Tribunal for Scotland



Decision with Statement of Reasons of the First-tier Tribunal for Scotland (Housing and Property Chamber) under Section 71 of the Private Housing (Tenancies) (Scotland) Act 2016

Decision (in absence of the Respondent)

The First-tier Tribunal for Scotland (Housing and Property Chamber) ("the Tribunal") determined that

Background

This is an application for an order for payment of rent arrears alleged to be owed by the Respondent to the Applicant, in terms of his private residential tenancy at the Property. It called for a case management discussion ('CMD') at 2pm on 2 June 2023, by teleconference. The Applicant was on the line in person. The Respondent did not call in to the conference and was not represented. The commencement of the CMD was delayed by 10 minutes, to allow for any technical difficulty he may have been experiencing, but he did not get in contact. Notice of the CMD was served on the Respondent on 26 April 2023, by sheriff officers. The Tribunal considered that the Respondent was aware of the CMD and had chosen not to attend; and that it was therefore fair to proceed in his absence.

• Findings in Fact

The application was undefended. The Tribunal considered that the following facts were relevant to its determination of the case:

- 1. The Respondent lets the Property from the Applicant in terms of a private residential tenancy with a start date of 8 May 2018.
- 2. In terms of that tenancy agreement, rent of £995 is payable on the eighth day of each month.
- 3. This application was raised for the sum of £10,430.
- 4. As of the date of the CMD, the Respondent was in arrears of rent of at least the sum sought.
- Reasons for Decision
- 5. The Respondent owes at least the sum sought to the Applicant. An order for payment of that sum should therefore be made.
- Decision

Order made for payment by the Respondent to the Applicant of the sum of £10,430 (TEN THOUSAND, FOUR HUNDRED AND THIRTY POUNDS STERLING).

**Right of Appeal** 

In terms of Section 46 of the Tribunal (Scotland) Act 2014, a party aggrieved by the decision of the Tribunal may appeal to the Upper Tribunal for Scotland on a point of law only. Before an appeal can be made to the Upper Tribunal, the party must first seek permission to appeal from the First-tier Tribunal. That party must seek permission to appeal within 30 days of the date the decision was sent to them.
