Structural Reform

Current Structure

HOHP – applications concerning factoring/land management

PRHP – applications by private tenants against landlords concerning repair and rent.

Appeals to the Sheriff.

- Section 35 of the Private Rented Housing (Scotland) Act2011
- Housing (Scotland) Act 2014 third party applications
- Regulation of letting agents

hobp New Structures - overview

- Tribunals (Scotland) Act 2014
- President of Scottish Tribunals
- First Tier Tribunal
- Upper Tribunal

hohp New Structures – detail

First Tier Tribunal

- Chamber structure
- Each Chamber will have a President (or two)
- Property Chamber will include HOHP and PRHP jurisdictions
- •Other Chambers will incorporate other first-tier tribunals to deal with other areas MHTS, ASNTS etc

Upper Tier Tribunal

- appeals on a point of law
- Chamber Structure

Timescales

Administrative changes took effect in April 2015.

Transfer into new system planned for September 2016.

Other Tribunals will follow over next two years.

Electrical Issues

Landlords under a duty to have inspections carried out by a "competent person"

Competent person – NICEIC or SELECT member

Duty includes common parts for which the landlord has a maintenance responsibility. Landlords are likely to be contacting factors for confirmation
