

The First-tier Tribunal for Scotland (Housing and Property Chamber) (‘the Tribunal’) having determined on 21 January 2021 that the **Repairing Standard Enforcement Order (“RSEO”)** relative to the property dated 14 November 2019 should be varied, the said **RSEO** is **hereby varied** with effect from the date of service of this Notice in the following respects: -

1. The period allowed for the completion of the work required by the Order is extended until 21 October 2021.

Subsection 25(3) of the Housing (Scotland) Act 2006 does not apply in this case.

A landlord, tenant or third party applicant aggrieved by the decision of the tribunal may appeal to the Upper Tribunal for Scotland on a point of law only. Before an appeal can be made to the Upper Tribunal, the party must first seek permission to appeal from the First-tier Tribunal. That party must seek permission to appeal within 30 days of the date the decision was sent to them.

In terms of Section 63 of the Act, where such an appeal is made, the effect of the decision and of any order is suspended until the appeal is abandoned or finally determined by the Upper Tribunal, and where the appeal is abandoned or finally
